- On a good note, the number of reported disciplinary issues has seen a reduction, from an average of 20-30 issues per season, to only 10 this past fall season.
- However, the type of issues being reported is what is alarming. Referee assault and referee abuse is becoming more common (about 40% of the issues). We MUST, as individual clubs, let our coaches and spectators know that this type of behavior cannot and will not be tolerated.

6. Administrator's Report – Denise Moote

- Fall 2019 team and player registration and team divisioning and scheduling went smoothly - just a few issues.
- Club Reps. still need to do a better job in knowing where their teams should be placed (division-wise). This seems to be an on-going issue.
- Most game day roster issues came from Club and team officials not understanding the nuances and differences between dual-rostering and guest passcarding (THESE ARE NOT THE SAME!) and the misuse of guest players. All Club and team officials should know the RULES and LAWS regarding dual-rostering and guest passcarding! If unclear, ask me

prior to games!

To the attention of the WSSL Board and WSSL Administrator:

The following is a brief report on the duties of the WSSL Scorekeeper for the Fall 2019 season. I have also attached data collected from the fall season for review.

Total number of games:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Total number of games scheduled - 2464 ● 19 games cancelled (13 Select; 6 recreational) ● Total number of games needed reported - 2451
Score reporting compliance:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Select compliance: 100% ● Recreational compliance: 99% ● While the compliance was high it was not within the 24 hour requirement. A large portion of these came in the final 2 weeks of the season with prompting on my part.
Gamecard reporting compliance:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Select compliance: 80% ● Recreational compliance: 71% ● I encountered a large number of coaches and clubs who said that this was never required in the past (even though it has been) and were resistant to make sure they were sent in. ● I believe that this compliance number will get better as I continue in this role and everyone understands it is an expectation that I will follow up on.
Total number of forfeits:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Select league: 8 games - (1 – Ann Arbor United SC; 1 – Chaos; 1 – Michigan Jaguars (Dearborn); 5 – Michigan Rush (4 – Jackson; 1 – Downriver)) ● 12 Recreational (1, Canton SC; 4 – Dearborn SC; 1 – Farmington SC; 1 – Livonia SC; 3 – Northville; 1 – Redford SC; 1 – Wayne-Westland) ● It looked like the biggest reason for the number of forfeits was coaches being unresponsive in scheduling/rescheduling. Both Jackson Rush (select) and Dearborn SC (recreational) had teams that forfeited multiple games.
Communication:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● I sent out roughly 3500 emails with about half of them being reminders to turn in game cards or report scores online.
Suggestions for Spring season	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● I think education about the current expectations of calling in scores within 24 hours and sending in the gamecards in the same timeframe would be beneficial. Reminding teams to just snap a picture and send in the gamecard and then call in the score from the field would help with overall compliance.
